
Reminder: **If you don't already know all your times tables, I would definitely be using this time at home to practise and learn them all!**

Step One: Use the times table fact to help you answer the other questions:

Times table question	Division	Multiplication
8 x 6 =	48 ÷ 6 =	6 x 80 =
7 x 8 =	56 ÷ 8 =	80 x 7 =
9 x 4 =	_____ ÷ 4 = _____	40 x 90 =
6 x 9 =	_____ ÷ 6 = _____	90 x 60 =

Example to help you work out Step 2 and 3

Example Question: *Swimming sessions at a swimming pool cost £3.15 for children and £4.70 for adults. How much does it cost for three children and 2 adults to go swimming altogether?*



Maths:
Multiplication
and Division

First, I will **estimate** using rounding:
 £3.15 rounds to £3 and £4.70 rounds to £5.
 3 children need 3 tickets
 3 x £3 = £9
 2 adults need 2 tickets
 2 x £5 = £10.
 So the approximate cost for three children and two adults is £9 + £10 = £19

Now I will **calculate** the answers (either using mental or written methods)
 3 x £3.15 = £9.45
 2 x £4.70 = £9.40
 I now need to add these together to get the total.
 £9.45 + £9.40 = £18.85
 The answer is £18.85 (this is near to my estimate of £19!)

Estimate and calculate the answers to the following questions:

Step Two: If the swimming sessions at a swimming pool cost £3.15 for children and £4.70 for adults, what would be the cost for 3 adults and 5 children?

Step Three: If the swimming lessons at a swimming pool cost £2.95 for children and £4.25 for adults, what would be the cost for 3 adults and 7 children?

Choose one or more of the activities for today:	Science	This is the best time of year to get planting! Don't worry if you don't have packets of seeds – you can use the seeds from the food that you eat, such as apples and tomatoes. You don't have to have an outside space to plant seeds either – you could grow them indoors too! Start your planting by planting them in small pots until they get bigger and can be planted outside or into a bigger container.
	PE	Play Blast off! How to play: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play with a partner! Stand 3-5 steps apart. • Players make 10 catches and then swap sides, players then make 9 catches then swap sides, then make 8 catches and swap sides continuing the process until you reach 0. • Can you reach zero without dropping the ball?
	Mindfulness	Try this breathing activity 😊 Find a relaxing place, sit comfortably and set a timer for one minute. Breathe deeply in and out while paying attention to any sensations you notice or sounds you hear. Take another slow, deep breath. Imagine the air moving down into the lungs and back up. Take one more deep breath, hold for a moment, then release it.
