





# Year 5's Home Learning Letter

<p><b>Spelling</b></p>	<p><b>Rule:</b> Words with the 'e' sound spelt 'ie' (e.g. chief, piece, field)  <b>Spelling sentence:</b> The <b>chief</b> was <b>relieved</b> when he found the <b>piece</b> of the puzzle he <b>believed</b> was lost.                  Practise your spelling sentence (remember – you can practise on spelling shed too!)                  Think about all of the different techniques you could use to help you – perhaps you could try rainbow writing or pyramid words.</p>	
<p><b>Reading</b></p>	<p>Spend at least 15 minutes reading to yourself or an adult.                  How many stories can you think of where a character goes through a portal? Write a list!                  (e.g. Alice in wonderland – Alice goes through a rabbit hole to another land)</p>	
<p><b>Writing</b></p>		<p style="text-align: center;"><b>The Tunnel</b></p> <p>Over the next few days, you will start writing an adventure story where your character steps through the portal and is transported to another land.                  Plan your story – you could also draw your main character and describe their characteristics and flaws.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Opening – how will you introduce your character?</li> <li>2. Build up – how does your story get exciting?</li> <li>3. Problem – What challenge will your character face?</li> <li>4. Resolution – how is the problem resolved?</li> <li>5. Ending – how has your character changed as a result?</li> </ol> <p>Remember, you could always write a prologue or epilogue too!</p>
<p><b>Handwriting</b></p>		  <p>Practise m and p from the jumper family. Write five words which use an m and five which use a p.                  Don't forget to draw your trees in the margin! ☺</p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>Problem solving today! On each of these grids, the counters lie at the four corners of a square.
