Discussion of the Week

It was great to see so many of you at our Meet the Teacher evening on Wednesday. If you still have any questions, or were unable to attend, please don't hesitate to get in touch. This week we have gone into winter mode play times due to the grass being wet and muddy. At lunchtime, this means that we zone the limited playground space more to ensure that we can provide children with as much space as we can. This worked well last year. The children continue to be patient about this, and I hope to be ready with building update news very soon. Y6 have been doing Bikeability this week, which has helped to keep them busy and active. Children have also been building up their 1K a day laps, even though at times they have had to dodge the rain! Last Friday, TEAM Kings Copse organised a well attended event which kick started our fundraising for the goalposts. They raised a total of £500. On top of this, £58.71 was collected, which will start our sponsorship fund. We have one more week of laps to do and then we will collect sponsorship money after that. The children are looking forward to seeing what the final total will be!

The majority of the children continue wear their **uniform** with pride. A polite reminder that they should wear school shoes and have coats with them in case of inclement weather.
